Position Overview

To ensure compliance with the World Anti-Doping Code, Virtus has an Anti-Doping Committee to oversee all aspects of its doping control programme. The Committee is comprised of a number of independent practitioners who are responsible for advising and implementing Virtus anti-doping procedures.

Supporting this Committee is the TUE Committee, with specific responsibility for overseeing the processing and management of Therapeutic Use Exemption certificates.

Role description

Working collaboratively with other TUE Committee Members to review all TUE applications and any subsequent management.



This role requires just a small amount of time on a monthly basis.

<u>Specific qualifications</u>

- Must be a qualified medical practitioner with knowledge of doping control in sport and the banned substance list
- Must be fluent in English
- Must have regular access to email and able to react promptly to TUE requests
